

GENERAL INFORMATION

The building is basically set up in five wings. There is a sixth grade wing, a seventh grade wing, an eighth grade wing, an exploratory wing and a PE wing. Students have the majority of their classes in their respective grade level wing. Below is a general map of the building.






PARKING LOT PROCEDURE (DROP OFF/PICK UP)

Please do not use front bus loop OR the area at the west end of the building (between the Administration Offices and Creekside) as a drop off location. Please use the designated routes (please see the map) on the East side of the building (between Roosevelt Elementary and Creekside) when dropping off your child in the morning.

The doors at the end of the 7th grade hall (the west end of the building) will remain locked in the morning and throughout the day.

To help eliminate the congestion and minimize the risks of an accident, we ask that all student drop-offs occur at the designated zones (see map below). This will help facilitate a smooth flow of traffic and minimize the need for students to cross traffic.





GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING SCHEDULES

How is my child's class schedule determined?

All students take the following classes: language arts, math, science, and social studies. In 6th and 7th grade, all students will also take a rotation of Computers, Art, PE, and Spanish, with their choice of music (band, choir, or orchestra) or Encore as the last of six class periods for the year.

In 8th grade, students will have the opportunity to select from the following semester or year long electives:

All students are encouraged to participate in a music class, as there is much research on the brain and learning that supports the benefits of music education. If your child is enrolled in a music class, he/she will automatically be advanced in that class for next year unless there is a written request for a change submitted. If your child is not currently enrolled in a music class, and you want them to be, you must also submit the request in writing. Due to planning for class size and personnel, the expectation is that music students make a commitment for the entire school year.

Choir

For 6th graders, this is a beginning level music class where students learn proper vocal production and study quality literature while also advancing skills in the area of music reading. For 7th and 8th graders, this class is a continuation of more advanced literature and musical concepts.

2. Band

For 6th graders, this is an introductory music class that incorporates band instruments to involve students in a hands-on musical environment. Students are exposed to various styles of band repertoire as well as writing music and exposure to careers in music. For 7th and 8th graders, this class is a continuation of more advanced literature and musical concepts.

3. Orchestra

This class is an introductory music class that incorporates orchestra instruments to involve students in a hands-on musical environment. Students are exposed to various styles of orchestra repertoire as well as exposure to careers in music.

4. Encore

The Encore class **may** utilizes the curriculums of Technology Education, Language Arts, Performing Arts, Journalism, and Life Management. The students rotate through these curriculums changing classes every six weeks throughout the school year.

STUDENT RECOGNITION OPPORTUNITIES

Robert Hoover Athletic-Scholastic Award

This award honors outstanding athletes who, as nominated by their coaches, display excellence in athletic performance, skill, leadership, and coachability. The nominees must have competed in at least two sports this year.

Citizenship Award

This award (8th grade students only) is presented to a student who, throughout his/her middle school years, has shown great social awareness by giving respect and being sensitive to the needs of other students. This award is given by the school counselor in recognition of kindness, positive leadership, and inclusion of others.

Student of the Year

An award is given to two 8th grade students (a boy and a girl) for maintaining high standards of citizenship, portraying a positive attitude, being an outstanding role model, and demonstrating responsibility.



<u>Honor Roll</u>

The Honor Roll will recognize all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students who have earned an overall average of 3.0 or higher, and only one C in any scheduled subjects. Also, an All A Honor Roll has been established for students that have earned no grade lower than an A- in all scheduled subjects. The list of students achieving either Honor Roll will be displayed at school at the end of each marking period.

ASSESSMENTS AND ASSESSMENT OPPORTUNITIES

American College Test (ACT)

The ACT is a three and one-half hour exam that high school juniors and seniors take and is used to determine eligibility for college entrance. Students at the middle schools take the identical exam to earn entrance into the Hope College PATH program and to simply become more familiar with the test itself.
