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Hearing and Vision Testing

Lincoln Elementary will be hosting the Ottawa County Health Department for our annual Hearing and Vision testing on the following dates: Hearing Testing (Grades K, 2, 4) – Wednesday, November 19. Vision Testing (Grades 1, 3, 5) – Thursday, November 20. If a parent chooses to opt their child out of screening, written documentation is required and must include: *Student's name, date of birth, teacher, and grade; *Which screening is being declined (hearing or vision) and screening date; and *Parent's name and date. Important medical considerations: • Students with shunts or medically implanted devices should not receive a hearing screening due to potential magnetic interference with the headphones. • Parental consent is required for hearing screenings for students with insulin pumps or continuous glucose monitors.
